6. **Ellen L. Babinsky** is Associate Professor of Church History, Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary.
7. **Andrew J. Bacevich** is Professor of International Relations and Director, Center for International Relations, Boston University. He is the author of *American Empire*.
8. **Gil Bailie**, *Violence Unveiled. Violence Unveiled*. Gil Bailie is a teacher, lecturer and writer who for the past twenty years has been exploring the deeper spiritual and anthropological implications of the literary and scriptural traditions of Western culture. He is founder and director of the Florilegia Institute in Sonoma, California.
9. **Ray Bakke** is Executive Director of the International Urban Institute, Northwest Graduate School in Seattle, WA., which is a Doctor of Ministry program. He is a recognized leader, both ecumenically and secularly, in the field of urban missiology and is the author of several works on evangelism and urban ministry, including *the Urban Christian, A Theology as Big as the City*, and *A Biblical Word for an Urban World*.

11. **Karl Barth** was Professor of Systematic Theology at the University of Basel, Germany and is generally regarded as the greatest Protestant thinker of modern times. Karl Barth is the author of *The Humanity of God* (1960), *Evangelical Theology in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century*, and developed his major positions in his multi-volume *Church Dogmatics*. After retiring from the University of Basel, Barth remained active in teaching and writing until his death in 1968.

13. **Isbon T. Beckwith**, Ph.D., D.D. is a priest in the Protestant Episcopal Church, and has devoted his life to the teaching ministry. He served the University of Tennessee and Yale University as an instructor in Greek, was professor of Greek at Trinity College in Connecticut and later occupied the chair of New Testament interpretation at General Theological Seminary in New York City. His *The Apocalypse of John* was originally published in 1919.
14. **Eberhard Bethge** attended the universities of Konigsberg, Berlin, Wien, Tübingen and Halle. From 1935 to 1940 he was Assistant to Dietrich Bonhoeffer at the Church College of Finkenwade and other places. 1957-58 he spent as Visiting Scholar Lecturer at Harvard Divinity School. He was awarded the Honorary Degree of D.D. at Glasgow University in 1962, of Berlin University 1967, and of Berne in 1975, is the author of *Costly Grace: An Illustrated Biography of Dietrich* of which the New York Times wrote, "There is no doubt that this is *the* biography of Bonhoeffer." He participated in the same resistance to the Nazis for which Bonhoeffer gave his life.
15. **Karen L. Bloomquist** is a member of the Church and Society Staff, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

16. **Neal Blough** has served with Mennonite Board of Missions and Mission Mennonite Francais in Paris, France where he directed the Mennonite Study Center. He is the author of *Christologie Anabaptiste: Pilgram Marpeck et l'humanite du Christ*.
17. **Brian K. Blount** is Associate Professor of New Testament at Princeton Theological Seminary.
18. **Roland Boer** is Logan Research Fellow at the Center for Studies in Religion and Theology, Monash University, Melbourne, Australia. He is the author of *Marxist Criticism of the Bible, National Allegory in the Hebrew Bible, Novel Histories: The Fiction of Biblical Criticism, Jameson and Jeroboam, Western Marxism and the Interpretation of the Hebrew Bible, Knockin' on Heaven's Door: The Bible and Popular Culture, Last Stop Before Antarctica: The Bible and Postcolonialism in Australia, Marx, Method and Gottwald, and Tracking the Tribes of Yahweh*.
19. **Carole R. Bohn** is assistant professor of pastoral psychology, Boston University School of Theology. She co-edited *Christianity, Patriarchy, and Abuse*.

21. **Dietrich Bonhoeffer**, theologian and church leader, wrote such Christian classics as *Christ the Center, Life Together*, and *Letters and Papers from Prison*, before being executed by the Nazis in 1945.
22. **Marcus J. Borg** is Hundere Distinguished Professor of Religion and Culture at Oregon State University and author of the bestselling *Meeting Jesus Again for the First Time, Reading the Bible Again for the First Time, The God We Never Knew, The Heart of Christianity*, and is coauthor of *Jesus: A New Vision* with N.T. Wright. He was an active member of the Jesus' Seminar.
23. **D. David Stuart Briscoe** is one of the most widely traveled pastors of the evangelical world, having preached in over fifty nations. Born in Millom, Cumberland, England, he has served the Elmbrook Church of Brookfield, Wisconsin since 1970. Dr. Briscoe has written eleven other books on biblical themes, including *the Communicator's Commentary, Romans*.
24. **Wes Howard Brook** is Program Director for the Intercommunity Peace and Justice Center in Seattle. His books include *Becoming Children of God*. He co-authored *Unveiling Empire* with Anthony Cwyther.

29. **Raymond E. Brown, S.S.**, (1928-1998) was the Auburn Distinguished Professor of Biblical Studies at Union Theological Seminary in New York City. He is the author of some twenty-five books on the Bible and past president of three of the most important biblical societies in the world, by appointment of two popes (Paul VI in 1972, John Paul II in 1996) he was a member of the Roman Pontifical Biblical Commission. *Time* magazine has called him "probably the premier Catholic Scripture scholar in the U.S." is author of *A Crucified Christ in Holy Week, Essays on the Four Gospel Passion Narratives*.

30. **F.F. Bruce** is Rylands Professor of Biblical Criticism and Exegesis at the University of Manchester in England. Editor of the *Evangelical Quarterly* and General Editor of the *New International Commentary on the New Testament*, he is the author of a number of books, including *New Testament Development of Old Testament Themes*, *The Hard Sayings of Jesus*, *New Testament History*, *The New Testament Documents: Are they Reliable?*, *Paul: Apostle of the Heart Set Free*, and essays on ancient Biblical texts.
31. **Walter Brueggemann** is Professor Emeritus of the William Marcellus McPheeters Professor of Old Testament at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia.
